

RESOLUTION NO. 2026- 17

**A RESOLUTION OF
THE CITY OF FAIRFIELD BAY, ARKANSAS,
APPROVING DISPOSITION OF EQUIPMENT
AT THE FAIRFIELD BAY SENIOR COMMUNITY CENTER,
AND AT THE CITY-OWNED ANIMAL SHELTER BUILDING;
AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES**

WHEREAS, the City Council of Fairfield Bay has received a request from the Mayor, the Recorder-Treasurer, the Senior Community Center Coordinator, and the lessee of the City's animal shelter building, to update the City's Records, consistent with the City's responsibilities; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has discussed the disposition of an old "Bingo Console" and "media center" bookcase at the Senior Community Center, both of which are well beyond their useful life; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has discussed the disposition of the old washing machine and dryer at the city-owned animal shelter building, both of which are well beyond their useful life, and both of which have been replaced by the lessee; and


WHEREAS, the City Council has carefully considered the requests, and now approves the request for disposition of these items of personal property, and removal of these items of personal property from the City's books and records, accordingly (although none of these items of personal property has previously been included in the City's list of assets);

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF FAIRFIELD BAY, ARKANSAS, that:

1. The old Bingo Console at the Senior Community Center, and the media center bookcase are both beyond useful life, and have little to no residual value. The Mayor, the Recorder-Treasurer, and personnel at the Senior Community Center, are authorized to dispose of both items of personal property "as is," without warranty, at the best offer that is made, or to be made. The Recorder-Treasurer shall retain a statement or indication of the manner of disposition of these items of personal asset, and the value obtained, if any. Disposition by disposal as trash is also approved if the items are determined to have no residual value at all.


2. The old washing machine and dryer at the city-owned animal shelter building are both beyond useful life, and have little to no residual value. The Mayor, the Recorder-Treasurer, and City personnel, are authorized to dispose of both items of personal property "as is," without warranty, at the best offer that is made, or to be made. The Recorder-Treasurer shall retain a statement or indication of the manner of disposition of these items of personal property, and the value obtained, if any. Disposition by disposal as trash is also approved if the items are determined to have no residual value at all. Disposition as scrap materials is also approved if the items are determined to have value as scrap materials. A reverse internet auction, or other lawful method of disposition, is also authorized in the most expeditious manner possible if the items are in working order and are determined to have any residual value.
3. The Mayor, the Recorder-Treasurer, and City personnel, are further authorized to take any and all steps necessary to carry out this Resolution, which is effective immediately upon passage by the City Council. Publication by posting and newspaper shall take place as the Recorder-Treasurer shall decide.
